7 STEDFAST GOLF TOURNAMENT


It can only gets better..... the biggest participation ever......



Last but not least, my sincere appreciation to KL Stedfast for appointing me to be the representative at the Convention. God bless.
















































Activities of BB campers

What !!!! So far lah.





the birthplace of Sir William Alexander Smith















The 150th Anniversary (1854 - 2004) of the birth of the Boys' Brigade Founder was held at the BB Museum in Thurso with a wreath laying ceremony at Pennyland House.

Sir William Alexander Smith was born on 27th October, 1854 at Pennyland House, Thurso, Caithness, Scotland. He moved to Glasgow as a teenager following the death of his father and he was active in the 1st Lanark Rifle Volunteers.

Sir William founded The Boys' Brigade in Glasgow on 4th October, 1883 and has been acknowledged as an originator of modern work among young people. His legacy has stood the test of time and many of his training and leadership methods are still used to this day.

The object, "The advancement of Christ's Kingdom among Boys' and the promotion of habits of Reverence, Discipline, Self-respect and all that tends towards a true Christian manliness has remained the same, apart from the addition of the word "Obedience" in 1893. The design for the crest was the familiar anchor on which was inscribed the motto "Sure and Stedfast", taken from Hebrews 6:19 "which hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both Sure and Stedfast". The Biblical spelling of "Stedfast" has been retained.

The words and the symbol were to become emblematic in many features of the work of The Boys' Brigade as highlighted in the organisation's most popular hymn "We have an anchor that keeps the soul, Stedfast and Sure while the billows roll....".

DO YOU KNOW.....??? Sir Alex Ferguson, Manager of Manchester United FC, was a member of the 129th Glasgow Boys' Brigade Company. He still takes a keen interest and is involved in the work of the Boys' Brigade Companies and Districts throughout United Kingdom.

Sir Alex Ferguson, the Manchester United manager and former Scotland manager, credited his love of football and his understanding of leadership to his time with the Christian uniformed youth organisation that was formed in Glasgow more than 100 years ago. The Govanborn former apprentice toolworker told of the invaluable lessons he learned while a member of the 129th Glasgow Company.


Sir Alex, took time out from Old Trafford recently to pay a visit to Glasgow in his capacity as Honorary Boys' Brigade Vice-President was the star attraction at a ceremony at Glasgow Central Station to dedicate and name a Strathclyde Passenger Transport (SPT) Class 320 train "Sir William A Smith" on Wednesday, 27th October, 2004 to mark the 150th birthday of the founder of

Sir Alex Ferguson said: "As a former member of the Boys' Brigade I am delighted to be able to name a train after the founder, Sir William A Smith. The Boys' Brigade is a working institution and it does a great job in shaping the lives of young men. It is a great honour for the Boys' Brigade to have its founder commemorated in this way."

Sir Alex played his first football match for his brigade team in Glasgow while still at school. The 62-year-old manager said the skills he learned in the BB gave him the grounding he needed not just in his successful playing career, which included a spell with Rangers, ... but also his high-profile life as a manager. He is one of the most successful football managers in the world and he owes it all to his time with the Boys' Brigade.

Sir Alex began forging a reputation in football management by guiding Aberdeen to European Cup Winners' Cup honours in 1983, beating one of the elite names of world football, Real Madrid. It remains the last European trophy won by a Scottish team.

After waving the train from its platform, Sir Alex chatted with members of a local brigade before signing autographs. John Neil, president of the Boys' Brigade and former secretary of the Glasgow


